The Book Club meeting of the Westleigh Combined Probus Club was held on Monday the 14<sup>th</sup> July at 1:30pm after the monthly General meeting with 17 members attending.

The book discussed at the meeting was "Question 7" by Richard Flanagan.

The book created plenty of discussion and most members were not sure why the book was called Question 7. This book won a major prize for nonfiction - the Baillie Gifford.

The book is about love and the chain reactions that follow.

The book opens in Japan where Richard's father was working as a slave labourer near Hiroshima when the atom bomb was dropped. The story ends with Richard finding himself trapped in a rapid on a wild river in Tasmania and not knowing whether he will live or die.

It is a story about the choices we make in life. The author brings in the story of the affair of H.G. Wells and Rebecca West though the 1930's nuclear physics era. It was creating a chain reaction that once bought in was very hard to stop. Richard goes back to Japan and finds an old guard that was in the prison camp his father was in, however the guard has no memory of any violence in the camp.

Then the author explores the colonisation of Tasmania with the story of the European invasion on the aboriginal Tasmanians.

The third story is about himself and others. A story about Richard's own family in Tasmania, especially his father. So, Richard interweaves these stories and says that once something happens it does not go away; it is part of the past, present and future and part of the fabric of our being.

Truths, of one sort or another, come thick and fast as you read but always there are questions.

Athis was a book that most of us would have never picked up to read, but it made us think about the story and the meaning.

Our book for this month is a much lighter book to read called "Lessons in Chemistry" by Bonnie Garmus. It tells the story of a woman who becomes a cooking show host after being fired as a scientist. In 2023 this book became the most borrowed book from public libraries. An entertaining book that tells the story of a woman who was a scientist in the 1950-60s when women were not supposed to be in the scientific world and belonged in the kitchen!!!

Co-ordinator and Treasurer will handle member's payments.

Co-ordinator will provide you with a final list of attendees and the final payment amount.

## **GENEALOGY**

How to start your own family history research

Do you need help with your own family history research? I can provide information about software that can be bought for you to record your family history details and documents, on your own computer. You will be able to print out your ancestor and descendent trees.

I can provide information about the tools available for researching BDMs (births, deaths and marriages), immigrants and convicts, as well as UK censuses from 1841 to 1911 and UK parish and civil registrations of BDMs from early 1700s to the 20th century. You don't need to leave Australia to do it. And your research can be done on your home computer, much of it for free. But you will need to visit libraries, use the internet and send letters and emails. I've got details of the right websites and the right indexes where you can research the information you need.

Members should not hesitate to contact me if they have any questions about family history research they may be doing, or have hit a roadblock with their research, or they get to the stage of asking themselves "What do I do next?" Just send me an email, or letter, or phone me and I'll see what help and suggestions I can make. No charge.

#### **July Outing**

For July 38 members undertook a tour of the old Female Factory at Parramatta.

After (for some) a delicious morning tea at the Publique Eatery in Parramatta Square, we took the short Light Rail ride to the Ngara stop then walked 2 minutes to our meeting point.

#### What is the Parramatta Female Factory?

All female convicts who arrived in New South Wales in the 1820s and '30s without a husband or job faced a common fate – a "resident" of the *Parramatta Female Factory*, an imposing sandstone building located on the banks of the Parramatta River.

## Our visit

We were met by our guide Kerima-Gae, one of the volunteers associated with the Female Factory Friends group.

Over the course of 90 minutes Kerima-Gae regaled us with stories from those dim dark years, embellishing her account with photos of people and buildings from that era. Most entertaining.

One interesting point made was to do with the clock face on the tower – the numbers were expressed as Roman numerals, but the "4" was shown as "IIII", not "IV" as we see it today. This is because of the convention used back then. Most interesting.

After the visit some of the group took the Light Rail back into Parramatta for a most enjoyable lunch followed by the trip home.

#### **Outing to Newcastle by train and Ferry across to Stockton (using Opal Card)**

We've had an outing previously to Newcastle by train, but this time we will include a ferry ride from Queens Wharf to Stockton – just across the water. Ferries run very frequently.

Date: Monday 22 September

This will ensure that the leader is aware of your intention to participate and thus avoid disappointment of potentially missing out on the activity.
