Westleigh Probus - Checklist for Dinners/Lunches

Decide whether to organise a dinner or a lunch. (Dinners must be on the first Wednesday of the month, lunches on the second Wednesday to avoid clashing with other Probus activities.) Select restaurant - consider travel requirements of guests.

Phone or visit restaurant to :-

- Assess capacity (minimum of 30)
- Decide on a date. (See restrictions above.)
- Strike a deal on a menu. (Most people are happy with \$40-45 for a dinner, \$35-40 for a lunch.)
- Get the details of the menu. (Courses? Are tea and coffee included?)
- Find out whether Licensed or BYO. (If BYO, find out any corkage cost.)
- Payment can be made via your or Co-ordinator's credit card and re-imbursement sought from the Treasurer. (Find out if there is a fee for using a credit card.)
- Assess parking facilities or public transport arrangements.

Provide the Dinner Co-ordinator with all the above information.

Co-ordinator will handle all Newsletter publicity.

Co-ordinator and Treasurer will handle member's payments.

Co-ordinator will provide you with a final list of attendees and the final payment amount.

GENEALOGY

How to start your own family history research

Do you need help with your own family history research?

I can provide information about software that can be bought for you to record your family history details and documents, on your own computer. You will be able to print out your ancestor and descendent trees.

I can provide information about the tools available for researching BDMs (births, deaths and marriages), immigrants and convicts, as well as UK censuses from 1841 to 1911 and UK parish and civil registrations of BDMs from early 1700s to the 20th century. You don't need to leave Australia to do it. And your research can be done on your home computer, much of it for free. But you will need to visit libraries, use the internet and send letters and emails. I've got details of the right websites and the right indexes where you can research the information you need.

Members should not hesitate to contact me if they have any questions about family history research they may be doing, or have hit a roadblock with their research, or they get to the stage of asking themselves "What do I do next?" Just send me an email, or letter, or phone me and I'll see what help and suggestions I can make. No charge.

GARDENING

May Outing

The Gardening Group car-pooled this month and we set off for a long trip to the Mt Annan Botanical Garden which is on the western edge of Sydney between Campbelltown and Camden.

Fifteen people fitted into the cars. Many thanks to our drivers for their effort to get us all there in time for coffee.

Mt Annan is the largest Botanical Garden in Australia and was established in 1988 from farmland and Cumberland Woodland. It specializes in Australian Native plants. It is on 416 hectares and is one of the horticultural scientific hubs of Australia. Arriving just before 10am first it was coffee in the cafe then we met our guide Virginia.

After first giving us a potted history of Mt Annan she took us on a tour of the Plant Bank. The Seedbank was first established in 1986. The newer Plantbank has both conservation and research responsibilities and was opened in 2013. It includes the Wollemi Pine project to preserve this ancient plant.

We then moved to the Herbarium which has over a million essential historical and scientific worldwide specimens.

After lunch we met with John Fitzgerald who had made the trip out from the Royal Botanic Gardens in Sydney to show us over the Propagation areas. We examined the master beds, saw the propagating areas and the hothouses and sheds for the more advanced plants.

This area is generally closed to the public and we were very privileged to be shown over the area.

Just after 2pm we set off back to Sydney.

The weather was beautiful and sunny and we thoroughly enjoyed our day at Australia's hot climate Botanical Garden, Mt Annan.

This will ensure that the leader is aware of your intention to participate and thus avoid disappointment of potentially missing out on the activity.
